# **Food Service** – Cristy Croson, Supervisor



Cristy Croson shared plans for recognition of **National School Lunch Week** – October 12 – 16, 2020. This year's theme is Now Playing: School Lunch!

All students are encouraged to eat meals at school, with the temporary, universal free breakfast and lunch service made available through a USDA program that is expected to last through the end of the year, but could end earlier pending federal funding.

## **Transportation** – Curt Roorda, Supervisor

Curt Roorda provided a timeline update for launching a "Here Comes The Bus" app, and making it available to our district families. Here Comes The Bus is an easy-to-use website and app that enables parents to see the location of their child's school bus on a smartphone, tablet, or personal computer. # **Traffic Study**

The School Board unanimously approved a proposal submitted by Bolton & Menk, Inc. in the amount of \$5,800 to conduct a traffic study at Berg Middle School and Woodrow Wilson Elementary schools. The scope of work includes observations of school traffic patterns during arrival and dismissal times at the schools and creation of a list of ideas and options to be considered. District staff is working with the City of Newton (Police Department & Public Works), and Traffic Engineers on this project, which will be funded from the School Board specific budget. Results and recommendations from this traffic study will be presented at a future school board meeting.
